July 21 "Elfones" Shoestring reality film documenting the East Coast travels of a great contra band (Mara Shea, fiddle; Roger Gold, guitar) and caller (George Segebade). The film recalls the great "rockumentaries" of the 1970's with a distinctly "folky" flavor. A great tribute to this band from veteran director Alan Smithee.

July 28 "Evening Star" This aptly-titled film represents the final production and magnum opus of Greg Frock, who is retiring from producing this year to pursue a career as a huckster. Frock also narrates this gripping drama about a musical group at the peak of their game (Steve Hickman, fiddle; David Crandall, sax and flute; John Devine, guitar). Their flawless performance of folk music will leave you dancing in the aisle!
