Dawn Culbertson, 1951–2004

Dawn Culbertson, a BFMS member, a caller and musician for the Monday English dance, and a well-known personage on the Baltimore musical scene, died of an appar-



ent heart attack at the BFMS Thanksgiving night dance November 25. She had Thanksgiving dinner with BFMS friends, arrived near the end of the dance in time to do a contra dance or two and the last waltz, and then collapsed. She was 53.

While she died far too young, some of us find comfort in the knowledge that she had a lovely time the last few hours of her life, that she seemed to die suddenly and without pain, and that knowledgeable assistance was immediately offered.

Some of us knew Dawn in only one of her many creative roles and were surprised to discover how broadly she contributed to the creative life of Baltimore. Dawn called for English country dances, played recorders and lute in a variety of settings, sang both modern and early music, and founded two groups, the Baltimore Composers Forum and Vox Asylum, the later of which performed antiwar songs. In another persona, she played punk lute, covering rock tunes in classical lute style. A graduate of Towson and Peabody, she hosted the night classical program on the former WJHU-FM, produced an early music program for the station, and as a journalist and wrote perceptive reviews of jazz, classical, and modern music.

BFMS members participated in her memorial service on December 12 at the North Baltimore Mennonite Church, which was followed by a pot luck and an English country dance.
