

In Concert February 25: Village Harmony

Village Harmony, Vermont's acclaimed youth world music choir, will breeze into town this month for their first-ever concert in Baltimore, an area exclusive.

Village Harmony defies categorization. Rather than a smooth

blended choral tone, they cultivate a more raw and powerful sound appropriate to the diverse ethnic music that they perform. The young singers, ages 14–18, are trained in a remarkable range of vocal styles, including the cutting "hard-voice" of Balkan village music, the darker sonorities of Georgian singing, and the rich, mellifluous South African sound.

They sing from memory and frequently without a conductor, and their stage presence is informal and joyous.

Black South Africa has a

particularly rich repertoire of traditional four-part harmony singing, featuring a deep, full-throated singing style, full harmonies and syncopated rhythms. Virtually all the traditional songs have accompanying dance movements, with the steps often in cross rhythm with the musical beat. Village Harmony's South African singing has been enriched by extensive collaboration with Matlakala Bopape, director of the Polokwane Choir from Northern Province in South Africa.

Village Harmony is especially noted for its performances of the

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choral traditions of Eastern Europe. In contrast to South African singing, Balkan music features an ultra-bright and piercing singing style, dissonant harmonies, and catchy, irregular dance meters of 7, 9 and 11. Several of their Eastern European pieces

feature the Village Harmony band of accordion, fiddles, tambura and percussion.

Caucasus, Georgia has perhaps the world's most ancient tradition of polyphonic singing. Encompassing both sacred and secular repertoire, the traditional three-part songs feature a dark, sonorous vocal quality, steely dissonances and striking harmonic shifts and convergences. Over the past three years, Village Harmony directors Larry Gordon and Patty Cuyler have brought five different

Village Harmony groups to Georgia to study the traditional music.

Village Harmony programs always include hymns from the early New England and southern shape-note singing traditions, with their fiery religious poetry, lively four-part counterpoint and stark open harmonies. Their programs also include powerful new works in shape-note style by contemporary New England composers.

In past years Village Harmony has performed at the eastern division of American Choral Directors Association, on Garrison Keillor's Prairie Home Companion, and at the Smithsonian Institution. Each year their spring tour takes them somewhere new: to England, to Russia, to the mid-western United States, up and down the East Coast, or to Georgia and Alabama, where, without fail, they are received as one of the most exciting young singing groups of our time.

Village Harmony will perform on Friday, February 25, 2005, at 8 pm, at Woodbrook Baptist Church, 25 Stevenson Lane, Towson, MD. The cost is \$10 per person, \$8 for BFMS and affilicate members. Bring the entire family for \$24, \$20 for members.


