Fundamentally, the dance has been unable to attract and retain new, regular participants as quickly as others have left. This situation is repeating at many, if not most, venues around the country.

People may see dancing "as one of the many things that they could do, such as movies, shopping, going out drinking, dancing at clubs, or just staying home watching TV or reading," reflects Special Events Chair Perry Shafran. "We have to consider the dances as a part of a Baltimore cultural arts scene."

Among the options being discussed are changing the location, moving to a different night, modifying the program to attract younger people, starting and/or ending earlier, or even cancelling the series and focusing on the comments are welcome (\superpublicity@bfms.org).


