

Tribute/Benefit Concert for Kate Charles

Folk, Swing, & Old Time Music and Some Fine Morris Dancing Concert features Cathy Fink, Marcy Marxer, and the Critton Hollow String Band

Saturday October 1, 2005, 7:30 pm The Bryn Mawr School, 109 W. Melrose Avenue, Baltimore

Grammy winners Cathy Fink and Marcy Marxer, the Critton Hollow String Band, and the Bluemont Morris Dancers star in a fund-raising tribute concert for BFMS friend Kate Charles.

Cathy Fink and **Marcy Marxer** have performed together for over 20 years, winning two Grammy Awards (2004 and 2005) and nine nominations along the way for folk, bluegrass, and children's music. They sing, yodel, harmonize, spin tales, and play breathtaking instrumentals. Billboard Magazine calls their music "as close to flawless folk/bluegrass as it gets." Folk icon Tom Paxton says, "Cathy and Marcy are at home in a dozen musical styles. They swing you, jazz you, and old-timey you till you just give up and bliss out." At this concert, they celebrate the release of their 23rd CD, *Scat Like That*, on Rounder Records.

Hailing from Paw Paw, WV, the members of **Critton** Hollow String Band—Joe Herrmann

(fiddle), Sam Herrmann (hammered dulcimer) and Joe Fallon (banjo and more)-have been playing music most of their lives. Their music includes driving old-time songs, fiddle tunes, sensitively harmonized ballads, and traditional and contemporary folk songs. From appearances on NBC's Today

Show to NPR's Mountain Stage, Critton

Hollow has been delighting audiences and dancers throughout the U.S. and Canada since 1975. Sing Out Magazine says, "For those who worry that this music is dying, listen to Critton Hollow and take heart."

Co-sponsored by BFMS and the Waldorf School of Baltimore, the concert benefits **Kate Charles**, a long-time contra and square dance caller, old-time banjo and guitar musician, and morris dancer. She has been BFMS American Dance chair and secretary

of the Country Dance and Song Society (CDSS). She also taught at the Waldorf School of Baltimore for many years.

Several years ago, Kate was diagnosed with early-onset Alzheimer's disease and was forced to retire from calling, playing, and teaching. As her disability progressed, her BFMS and Waldorf School friends joined forces to help her stay in her own home in Waverly as long as possible. However, in June 2002, at

the age of 51, Kate had to move to an assisted living facility. Kate has since moved to a less expensive facility.

Music continues to be a big part of Kate's life. Every month, Cathy Fink and Marcy Marxer hold music parties at Kate's facility, bringing friends along to play and sing, and sometimes to do a few slow and easy contra dances. Cathy and Marcy suggested

> this concert as a way to honor Kate and to raise some badly-needed funds for her care. In addition, a silent auction is planned before the concert and during the intermission.

Whether you knew Kate or not, this is a chance for a really fine evening of music by superb performers.

In the spirit of self-empowerment, get off that Barca Lounger and join in the glory of Home-Grown Fun Day! It's not just an event; it's a revolution. After 10 years we've moved this event to September—when most folks are back from vacation.

For the first time ever, scheduled activities include a **free dance workshop** at 3 pm for teens and pre-teens. Charm City Rapper members **Laura Robertson** and **Kappy Laning** present a free Rapper workshop for teens and mature pre-teens. Rapper sword dance is an English tradition that likely originated with the miners who went to the pub after work and danced with their work implements (sweat scrappers). The swords are flexible steel blades (they aren't swords in the traditional sense of the word, nor is it rap in the modern sense of the word) and each dancer holds one end of the sword in one hand and their neighbor's sword in the other hand. Five or six people dance together to a fast jig step, doing figures and jumps and flips while staying connected to each other with the swords. Hey, peeps, what could be cooler than performing death-defying stunts with swords? But don't worry, it's, uh, relatively safe. Laura and Kappy have lead many rapper classes and Laura is the creative energy behind the exciting dances done by Charm City Rapper. We invite teens to come to this workshop, no experience necessary, only a willingness to work closely together with others and a sense of timing and fun. Hard-sole shoes are recommended. Dear Crabby



My knee cartilage ain't what it used to be, and my legs get tired and sore after about an hour of dancing, but the guys still make me do twirls. **Ouch!** I tried wearing an "injured leg" button but nobody paid any attention. It's a choice between hurting my knee and getting my shoulder dislocated from not spinning. What can I do?

Dear Gal,

Try being a bit crabbier. My exoskeleton helps keep the connective tissue connected. You could try a knee brace for support during those exuberant circular motions such as swings and twirls. If someone forced me into a twirl, I might pinch his fingers off, but that's a bit drastic. If you're able, resist that upwards yank, or just disengage your right arm a beat or two early.

And guys, remember that dancing is something you do *with* her, not *to* her. Twirls are optional "style points" and should be by mutual consent. Besides, a courtesy turn, performed well, is more fun (and flirtatious) than a twirl. Try dancing the lady's role sometime; you might be surprised.


