I'm always happy to get a compliment—but a little help would be even more welcome. It really doesn't take all that much time, about a day for each issue. The real trick is doing as much as possible ahead of the deadline. I built a database for the newsletter in Access. As event announcements come in, I copy them into the database. Reminders, confirmations, and even the formatted newsletter text get generated when I need them. I lay out the issue in Adobe InDesign because it's got extensive automation features, but previous editors have had good results with PageMaker and Microsoft Publisher. The last two editors did get busy unexpectedly. Replacements step ped up when needed, but I'd feel a lot better knowing I've got a backup. Any takers?
