Mid-Winter Ball Features Robert Cromartie & Atlantic Crossing*

Saturday, February 11, 2006

Yo ho ho! The Mid-Winter Ball has been a Baltimore Folk Music Society tradition for 25 years now. No other Baltimore contra dance event brings together the number of dancers under one roof with the sheer energy and enthusiasm that the Mid-Winter Ball does. To celebrate this anniversary year, we're having a very special Pirate Jamboree. In addition to dancing, the evening is filled with surprises to make it a most memorable event.

The talented and popular caller **Robert Cromartie**, from Chapel Hill, NC, makes a very rare Baltimore-area appearance. A perennial favorite among knowing dancers, Robert appears regularly

at dance camps and weekends throughout the country. It's been years since Robert appeared in Baltimore, so make sure you come out to enjoy this exclusive engagement of one of the East Coast's top callers.

Robert is calling the figures to the high-energy music of **Atlantic Crossing**. Their playing features tunes from the New England contra tradition, driving French-Canadian reels, bouncy Irish jigs, and Cape Breton strathspeys, all played with flair and the band's unique sound and intricate arrangements as they use traditional music as a vehicle for creativity, artistic expression and in-

novation. Atlantic Crossing has been accepted to the Vermont Arts Council's juried register, a selection of the state's best artists.

Brian Perkins provides the variety of bouzouki, tenor banjo, mandolin, feet, and vocals. He's a versatile performer, music teacher and accomplished sound technician. Rick Klein, an experienced dance musician, composer, and licensed skipper, provides solid rhythm support with his guitar. The dueling fiddles of Viveka Fox and Peter Macfarlane add a layer of harmony to the exuberant sound, and the multitalented Fox, a musician in the Gaelic and North American folk traditions since her childhood, also livens up jigs with her bodhran. Macfarlane, a native of the United Kingdom, brings the traditions of the North Sea coast alive.

Rick, Brian and Peter are all accomplished vocalists excelling in close harmony to capstone the group's musical interest. It's a very

special sound and an amazing dance experience.

Beware, matey. There be surprises and special events that promise to make this an evening you won't soon forget. For after all, what's a pirate gathering without treasure hunting and skullduggery? Although costumes are not required, you are welcome to dress in pirate finery, or attend in your favorite festive dance clothes.

The traditional reception starts at 7 pm. The dancing community brings a wide array of delectable treats, many featuring chocolate. It's a great chance to catch up with old friends, admire the fancy and outrageous outfits your fellow dancers have put together, and



nibble some delicious nosh. The usual grand march is supplanted this year by a "Parade of Rogues" to get you out onto the dance floor and meet and greet everyone.

So buy your tickets now and plan for a fabulous evening at the Mid-Winter Ball. It's a chance to dress up and experience an outstanding caller and a great band. Buy your tickets soon: They are first-come, first-served and going as fast as pirate loot. It's \$20 per landbubber, \$16 for BFMS members, or \$10 for Towson University Students. These discounted prices end January 15. After that the tribute is \$25 (\$20 members/\$10 TU students). Tickets are available online, by mail, and from a ticket agent at most BFMS events.

Summary of BFMS Board Meeting December 6, 2005

Paul Ballard reported that St. Mark's has tripled the amount they are charging to use the church for dances and other events. Although the rental amount is still reasonable compared to other venues, this is causing a strain on the Monday night English dance and the Second Saturday dance. We are looking at ways to offset that increase, for example cutting back on set up and clean up time at dances. The best way to offset the increase would be to bring in more dancers. Just 7 new dancers at the Monday night dance would offset the increase. Consider making the Monday night dance a part of your social calendar and talk it up with your friends.

The Tellabration storytelling event was a success, the children, especially, enjoyed it. Mid-Winter Ball sales are going well.

Jessie Newburn, who is doing a special project on marketing, showed the new BFMS "business cards" she has designed. Look for them at a dance and pick up a few to put in your wallet. When you find yourself talking to someone about the folk community and how wonderful it is, pull out a card. The card has a listing of BFMS activities, including non-dance events, and gives the BFMS web address for more information. Jessie also suggested checking out tribe.com, an online community that would be helpful for introducing new people to contra dance. There are tribes for contra dancers in Baltimore and DC. Look to the weekly BFMS e-mail newsletter or the monthly printed newsletter for more information.

There was a resolution passed to honor Jim Newburn for the significant contribution he has made to the dance community through his ownership of Buffalo Gap Community Camp and his support of Buffalo Jambalaya and other dance camps.
