Long to do some singing? Tired of singing alone in the shower? Join us for an evening of spirited community singing and creative

harmonizing, led by songmeister Don Friedman. Don, who lives in Brooklyn, NY, leads the evening song jam at the Augusta Heritage Vocal Week, the summer meeting place of choice for folksingers, in Elkins, WV.

Don has been playing guitar and singing for many years. Although some of his earliest playing was with a high school rock band, "The Soul Searchers," he was particularly influenced by the folk music revival of the 1960s. He plays and sings a wide range of music, including folk, bluegrass, singer-songwriter, country, and old rock, with occasional forays in other directions. Don has recently been exploring

old-time and other more traditional music, as well as songs from other countries. He has a great ear for harmony, plays rhythm and lead guitar, and has recently taken up the mandolin. By day, he is an anti-poverty lawyer, and, as his union's semi-official troubadour, has played on picket lines and at union rallies.

As far as performance goes, Don is singer and guitarist (add a pinch of mandolin) with Triboro, a New York City-based trio that performs an eclectic array of acoustic music. He's also the Don of duet Jenny & Don, which performs in the NYC area as well, playing bluegrass, blues, country and other acoustic music.

You don't have to be a singer to participate; you just have to

enjoy singing! All are welcome. We'll have some copies of words to hand out. We guarantee that you'll hear some familiar songs and learn some new ones. Help us keep (vocal) music in the Baltimore Folk Music Society!

Jim Newburn: A Tribute

Last year was one of significant passage for the dance communities of Baltimore and Washington. After many years of operating as a camp and respite for our community, Buffalo Gap Camp was sold. This passage is a time of reflection. Many of us have been attending camps at Buffalo Gap for at least a decade. For this we must thank Jim Newburn, who has maintained the camp since 1996 for the dance community.

Buffalo Gap Camp for the Creative Arts had been in business for many years. Dancers who attended international, contra, swing and Cajun/Zydeco over the years had fallen in love with the camp. Sadly, after some fires and management issues, bankruptcy put the camp on the auction block.

Jim bought Buffalo Gap Camp to maintain as a community dance resource. While Jim is a successful land developer, he was entering new ground as a camp owner. But Jim hired staff and put together a good camp lineup from 1996 until 2005.

After this past season Jim reluctantly put the camp up for sale. It's not easy to maintain a dance camp under any circumstances. Many camps operate only on weekends and this leaves a lot of time

with no revenue coming in. Jim went to great personal expense in his efforts to keep the camp operating but finally felt it was time to move on.



Without Jim, many of the attendees of camps at Buffalo Gap would never have known the beauty and tranquility of this wonderful spot. Escaping for a weekend of dance has brought countless people to the local and national dance communities. Thank you, Jim, for keeping Buffalo Gap Camp in the dance community for so many years.

On Saturday, March 11, BFMS honors Jim Newburn at the Somebody Scream dance featuring Leroy Thomas and the
