## **Summary of BFMS Annual Meeting** March 1, 2006

The Baltimore Folk Music Society held its Annual Meeting on March 1, 2006, before the regularly scheduled American Contra and Square Dance.

The President, Treasurer, and other officers presented status reports. BFMS shows a \$7,500 net operating loss since March, 2005. Updates are in progress for the BFMS Operating Manual, which was last revised in 1995. A new location and date was announced for the Buffalo Jambalya weekend.

The Nominating Committee presented its slate of candidates for the 2006-07 Board and solicited nominations from the floor. There were no additional nominations, and no positions were contested. Under the Society's By-Laws, the nominees are deemed elected. During the transitional month of June, both outgoing and incoming officers serve on the Board.
