- 2001:Mike Franch was president and Ralph Barthine was vice-president. Joyce-Duffy Bilanow called the Aug. 15 contra dance with Mortal Wombat, and the summer newsletter was July/August rather than today's June/July.
- 1996:Christopher Field was president, and Marge Scerbo was vice-president. Kate Charles called the Aug. 21 contra dance, and the newsletter debuted in the format it appears today.
- 1991: John Bartholomew was president, and Monica Beltran was vice-president. Marcy Amos and Peggy Myers were also board members. Contra dance admission was \$4 for members and \$5 for non-members, and Bob Dalsemer called contra dances monthly.
- 1986:John Bartholomew was president, and Diane Schmit was vice president. Bob Dalsemer called dances twice in August, and Tom Hinds called the Aug. 20 dance with Steve Hickman and Claudio Buchwald. English Country dancing occurred Thursdays at the Church of the Redeemer. Dance admission was \$3 and annual memberships were \$10.
- 1981: Kate Newman was president, and Kate Charles president. Bob Dalsemer called dances three times a month, and admissions were just \$2. Annual membership was \$5.
