It is a wonderful respite before the hectic rush of the holiday season, to sit back and laugh, and cry, and be totally enthralled by the ancient art of storytelling. We are honored to have two wonderful hosts that will guide us through this enchanting journey.

Julia Hammid will MC the family stories, and Ab Logan will MC the adult stories. Julia has been a lover of stories all her life, starting with listening to her father make up bedtime stories for her and her brother. She soon became an avid reader, but did not rediscover live storytelling until she met up with the storytelling circle in Albany, N.Y., almost 20 years ago. Ever since then she has been enjoying listening and telling whenever she gets a chance. You will not want to miss the family stories, because as many folks have learned over the years, some of the best stories are told during the family stories.

Many folks think of Ab Logan as our local Garrison Keillor. He grew up in Pittsburgh in the cozy hamlet known as Our Lady of the Most Blessed Sacrament parish, an endless source of his stories. Eventually he went forth to seek his fortune, a project that is still under way. For the past 23 years his students at Boys Latin have had the pleasure of having a teacher who is also a great storyteller.



Editor's Corner


