The 2007 Mid-Winter Ball is coming soon! Last year's Ball was described by many as "the best contra event ever" and this year, we are committed to topping it! To start, the ball will feature the incredible calling talents of **Susan Kevra**, teamed with the energetic music of **The Moving Violations**. And the Chesapeake Room at TU will be transformed into the elegant but wild Moulin Rouge, a dance club for the ages.

Originally New England-based, the renowned **Susan Kevra** is now a French professor in Nashville, TN. Her clear teaching and varied repertoire of dances have graced many dance weeks and festivals. She enjoys singing squares as well as traditional and modern contra dances. The versatile Susan is also a fine clarinetist, and appears on the well known CD, "*Pris au Jeu*," a recording by the French Canadian band, Domino. Her capable calling will keep your feet moving.

For your dancing pleasure we are excited to welcome **The Moving Violations**. A Massachusetts-based band, they meld traditional New England contra music with original compositions, classical music, Scandinavian, Eastern European and klez-

mer influences into a truly unique and powerful sound. Van Kaynor (of the Kaynor family) and Ron Grosslein (of Swallowtail) are two of the top fiddlers in the country, and create intricately interlaced lines of harmony. Becky Ashenden provides driving rhythm on piano. Chuck Corman on bass, guitar, and percussion brings over 30 years of dance music experience to the stage. You never know what you might hear; you know whatever it is, it will be great dance music.

This year, we will transport you to *fin-de-siècle* Montmartre, for an evening at the Moulin Rouge. Your congenial hosts will spare no effort to insure your night of exhilaration will be second to none, whether you're *belle* or bohemian, *artiste* or aristocrat. One flat admission fee will enable you to dance all night with

partners of your own choosing, and the "water" and "punch" will flow freely. Since we are \*ahem\* having a little trouble with our liquor license right now, we regret to announce that absinthe will not be available, but Le Salon des Beaux-Arts will feature the scandalous works of the so-called "post-impressionist" artists.
