It's that time once again for our annual BFMS membership meeting. All members are invited to come and join us over a potluck dinner as we discuss the state-of-the-BFMS. We summarize all the great things that we did over the past year and consider what

we can do in the coming year.

The most important part of the meeting is nominating folks to serve on the board. We are asking YOU to consider serving on the board. See Page 9 for a list of positions and the name of the person currently serving on the board. All positions are open! Board mem-

bers are elected to serve a 13-month term of office starting June 2007 and lasting through June 2008. We meet once a month on

the first Tuesday at the month at the home of a board member, with a potluck sometimes before each meeting and an ice-cream social at the end of every meeting.

You do not need any experience to serve in any of the positions, we will hold your hand and train you. Some positions take more work than others (such as Publicity, Membership, or Special events). Others require mainly attendance at meetings (Secretary, Member-at-large). And others put you in charge (President, Dance Chairs)! If nominated, the BFMS members vote by ballot mailed to their homes, and if elected, you begin serving on June 5, 2007!

Coffeehouse Concert featuring Greg Shupe and friends Saturday, March 31, 2007 8:00 PM Woodbrook Baptist Church, 25 Stevenson Lane, Towson MD

On March 31 BFMS will feature a coffeehouse concert by **Greg Shupe**, BFMS member and long time local musician who will be celebrating the completion of his new CD "Midnight Train". Greg has been performing around the US, Australia, New Zealand, Great Britain and the Caribbean since his college days in Minnesota and West Virginia. Some will remember him from past coffeehouse and Baltimore Folk Festival performances.

Greg grew up in southern West Virginia, where the influences of traditional mountain music, country music, and union songs had a profound effect on his musical sensibilities. A social worker by trade, he has been living and working in Baltimore for over twenty years.

Accompanying himself on guitar (and occasionally mandolin) he has played at festivals, clubs, colleges, coffeehouses, benefits, and rallies. His wide repertoire of folk, blues, country, bluegrass, traditional, swing, political, union and humorous songs from around the world has been shared with thousands of people.

Known for the many sing-alongs he includes in his performances, he will give ample opportunity to join in the singing;



song sheets will be available for the lyric-ly challenged. He will also entertain with a variety of off beat songs like "Last Words (Can I Have All Your Stuff When You're Dead?)". He will also be performing a number of original tunes, including the title track from the CD.

Joining Greg will be three musicians featured on "Midnight Train": **Dennis Diamond** (mandolin, guitar, dobro, piano); **Zachary Diamond** (fiddle, percussion); and **Doris Justis** (vocals). **Duane Geruschat** will play bass and other area musicians will also join in the fun.

Pine Leaf Boys have made a name for presenting their own inimitable brand of traditional Cajun and Creole music with youthful exuberance. Being described as "...the link that connects the young and the old generations," and "the best new energetic and fun Cajun band in a very long time," the Pine Leaf Boys play the dance hall standards, as well as making a point to bring many of the more obscure songs of past masters into their repertoire and playing them with gusto. Skillful multiinstrumentalists, it's not uncommon to see them switch and trade-off during their raucous shows. All five members, in their early 20s, Wilson Savoy, Cedric Watson, Jon Bertrand, Drew Simon and Blake Miller live in Lafayette. Seeped in music since children and hailing from farms and villages in Cajun country, the Pine Leaf boys have been preserving the traditional Cajun sound, while allowing it to breathe and stretch with those who



play it. They present their music in multiple configurations such as twin fiddle, duo accordion fiddle, bass, drum and even stomping jures. No one can sit through their foot stomping energetic performance. Welcome them back to Catonsville.

T Broussard & The Zydeco Steppers *

Bryant Keith "T" Broussard's fate as a Zydeco musician was sealed long before he was born. He is a descendent of Creole and Zydeco music icons, such as his Mother, Mary Jane Ardoin, Bois Sec Ardoin, Carlton Frank and Queen Ida. Bryant recalls childhood memories of playing drums or scrub board while his mother performed for audiences at local dances. It was not until 1993, at the age of 21 that he began to take his talents seriously and established his own band. Since then he has worked with unwavering amibition to achieve excellence in his destined career. Bryant's stage presence exudes a remarkable energy. He has been booked for performances from coast to coast. Those who attended Buffalo Jambalaya in 2004 still talk about the excitement in the air when he was on stage. His winning personality and charm was well appreciated by the crowd. Everyone danced and some just watched him perform in amazement. Come on out and have a good time!

First, Mary Cliff, a gem on WETA radio in DC for over 30 years, fell victim to the re-formatting of the Washington-area public radio station to all-classical. For a period of time, Mary was without a radio station until DC's other public radio station, WAMU, picked up most of WETA's programming, including Mary Cliff's *Traditions* (and the *Prairie Home Companion*, among others). The show can now be heard at 11 pm on Saturday nights on WAMU (88.5 FM), which can be heard throughout most of the Baltimore area. No doubt it was the loud and unified voice of the folk music community that helped WAMU make the decision to keep one of the area's few folk music programs on the radio.

Second, Joyce Sica, of Baldwin's Station and Cellar Stage concerts, lost her internet provider. For some reason, the provider believed that she was spamming, so they totally cut her off. Several members are or know people who work for this internet provider (to remain nameless in this column), and have volunteered to see what they can do. All this was done voluntarily, as Joyce is another long-time well-known producer of folk music in the Baltimore area, and her loss of her internet was not deserved, and it is heartening to see members of the community step up and lend a hand.

In this vein, the BFMS board is looking for a few new members. Now is the time to submit a nomination, including yourself, for any position on the board. This would be a great time to give back to the community that has served folkies in the Baltimore area for over 30 years. Your best bet for a stress-free, low-commitment position is a Member-at-Large. Listen in, voice in the concerns of the community, and enjoy some ice cream after each meeting.
