Baltimore joins in this event for the thirteenth time thanks to the support of The National Storytelling Network, The Baltimore Folk Music Society and the Fourth at Four Storyfolk. The tradition started in 1988, when storyteller J.G. Pinkerton decided to bring the joy of stories back into the lives of adults. From a modest start of six sites in Connecticut, Tellabration! spread to hundreds of sites on every continent except Antarctica.

You will hear stories of every variety, from personal stories to legends, myths, and fairy tales; from factual, historical stories to stories of pure fantasy. You will not want to miss the family stories, because as many folks have learned over the years, some of the best stories are told during the earlier segment. 
