English Country Dance

Pride and Prejudice. Emma. Sense and Sensibility. All of these movies based on Jane Austen books - and they all have such high-energy dances! It's almost like contra dance, but not quite...What could it possibly be?

To many people's surprise, that's English Country Dance. English Dance isn't all the "slow and boring" dancing that so many dancers claim. Rather, there are many exciting and fast moving dances. And elegance... There's definitely a high level of elegance. Long graceful loops, weaving patterns, graceful turns and circles done to wonderful music.

Like to flirt? This is definitely the dance for you. With limited touching allowed -- very few dances have swings -- it's all in the eyes.

The dances are a mix of traditional dances written hundreds of years ago and more recent compositions, many by local callers and dancers. The music ranges from slow and stately to light and playful. Each dance has a specific tune associated with it, perfectly matched to the movements of the dance.

Dances are walked through and called. An assortment of local musicians treat our ears each week as well.

On May 4, Tom Spilsbury will be calling to music by Carl Friedman on fiddle, Robin Wilson on flute and concertina, and Judy Meyers on piano.



May 11, we're treated to a now-local-but-originally-from-England caller, **Michael Barraclough** (left). Michael often brings along some of his own reinterpretations of traditional Playford dances. He will be joined by musicians **Marty Taylor** on recorder and concertina, **Judy Meyers** on piano, and **Emily Aubrey** on fiddle.

May 18 will feature some fun and lively dances as **Christopher Field** calls to **The Geud Band of Baltimore**, our very own English Open Band (see page 3).

Then it'll be a memorable Memorial Day on May 25 as **Mike Franch** (below) finishes the month for us, calling to tunes by **Jeff Steinberg** on fiddle, **Karin Loya** on cello, and **Ben Hobbs** on piano.

The jams are open to everyone interested in playing, learning to play, or listening to acoustic blues. The jams are free, but donations are welcome to help defray costs of the facility and to support the foundation's educational programs.

The weekly jams began more than 50 years ago by legendary bluesman Archie Edwards at his barbershop in northeast Washington and carried on by the foundation after he passed away in 1998. When the barbershop building was sold last year, the jams were suspended temporarily while the foundation sought a new home.

In addition to the weekly jams, the foundation will hold workshops and concerts at the Riverdale location. Del Ray will offer a two-session blues song-writing on April 1 and 2, and a blues ukulele workshop on April 2.


