To add even more fun to your day, come to one of their workshops at 4:30. **Aubrey** is a gifted clogger and teacher - all levels are welcome! **Elwood** will lead his Folk Song Sing-A-Long workshop at the same time, using a wide variety of traditional and contemporary folk songs that he and his wife Aubrey have collected while teaching and performing throughout the US and beyond. Participants are welcome to bring an instrument of choice (please have knowledge of basic chords)! Feel free to bring one of your favorite folk songs, too. Depending on the level of difficulty, bring enough copies for all participants (usually 15 to 25 is a good quantity). Listeners welcome, too.

The highly praised husband-wife duo blends gorgeous vocals with an astonishing array of instruments including the mountain dulcimer, old-time banjo, tin whistle, guitar, limberjack, mandolin, harmonica, feet and more. They often collaborate with other musicians, Cathy Clasper-Torch, Heidi and John Cerrigione, and Uriah Donnelly; and Irish step-dancer Kevin Doyle; and can be seen performing solo, as a

J. Patrick's All-Stars and the Baltimore Folk Music Society present a concert of traditional Irish music featuring fiddle player **Kevin Burke**, joined by **Cal Scott** on guitar and vocal. Local favorites **Ken Kolodner** and **Jim Eagan** will open the show.

**Kevin Burke**, a world-renowned Irish fiddle master, plays in the beautifully fluid, highly ornamented style of County Sligo. A member of the Bothy Band and Patrick Street, he has toured and recorded with Kate Bush, Arlo Guthrie, Paul Brady, Christy Moore, Michael O Domhnaill, and the Celtic Fiddle Festival. He was awarded the National Heritage Award in 2002, America's highest honor in the traditional arts. Multi-instrumentalist **Cal Scott** brings a seasoned and complementary aesthetic to his guitar accompaniment. A composer, with extensive film and television scores to his credit, he frequently includes some of his own songs when performing with Kevin Burke. *(Continued on page 3...)*

The Irish Times characterizes their collaboration, *Across the Black River*, as "... a master class in eclectic musicianship, coloured by a restraint born of experience and fluidity that surely owes much to their comfort in one another's company." They have teamed up again for *The Irish Session Suite*, a new work consisting of ten traditional tunes arranged in four movements. Kevin's fiddle leads the traditional tunes through Cal's beautifully scored arrangements played by some of the Northwest's finest musicians. We expect this concert to be one of the first venues where this CD will be available.

Baltimore musicians **Ken Kolodner** and **Jim Eagan** will open the concert. Ken Kolodner is widely recognized as one of the most influential hammered dulcimer players in the United States and a highly respected old-time fiddler. Fiddler Jim Eagan grew up as a regular at the traditional music sessions at J. Patrick's pub in Baltimore's Locust Point. Jim has played with Mick Moloney in The Greenfields of America, performed with the Chieftains, and has been a member of the John Whelan Band and O'Malley's March (led by Governor Martin O'Malley).

J Patrick's All Stars, now operating as part of the BFMS Special Events committee, is a group of local players and aficionados of Irish traditional music. Stay tuned for announcements of future concerts and workshops.
