There is plenty of street parking at the church.

Tellabration! originator J. G. Pinkerton envisioned this international event as a means of building community support for storytelling. In 1988 the event was launched by the Connecticut Storytelling Center in six locations across the state. A great success, Tellabration! extended to several other states the following year, and then, in 1990, expanded nationwide. By 1997, there were Tellabration! events on every continent but Antarctica. (Know any good penguin storytellers?) BMS has been sponsoring Tellabration! in Baltimore since 1996.

Dear Smelling: Even though the common wisdom is that perfume makes you more appealing, at a contra dance, it can have the opposite effect. As you dance your body heats up and that spritz of perfume fills the air around you, even though you may be used to it and can barely smell it. Many contra dancers are sensitive to perfumes and actually start to cough and wheeze when they get around them. There are people who are so sensitive that they come to the door before paying for a dance and take a sniff to see if it is safe for them to go on the floor and dance. Contra dancers appreciate your inner beauty and you don't need to layer on a scent to please your partners. Try coming to the dance without wearing perfume. You will still be attractive to other dancers and you will help make the environment safe for everyone to enjoy the dance.
