Member-Sponsored House Concerts

In addition to all the dances and other events that BFMS sponsors each month, we are thrilled to let you know about the house concerts that our members host. These concerts are a wonderful experience. How often do you get to see great singers and musicians in such an intimate setting? Instead of being one of the many faces in a crowd, you get an up-close chance to talk to and share music with some of the greatest folk artists around!

This month, McGregor Yatsevitch and Barbara Svoboda are hosting two incredible concerts. You won't want to miss either!



On Saturday, April 2, there will be a concert with the **Maudlin Brothers**. **Ed Norman** and **Tim Wells** (left) - who may be joined by **John Moore** for this concert - play a variety of vocally-oriented string band music. Their repertoire includes humorous old-time songs, brother duets, soulful early bluegrass, uplifting a cappella gospel, and tantalizing harmony yodeling and cowboy songs. The most distinctive part of their sound is the vocal blend, whether it's two of them pretending to be real brothers, a trio creating that high lonesome sound, or a full quartet performing "without no music at all." Although they sing plenty of weepers, their music is not always as sad as their

name might imply. Get ready to laugh, cry, dance, and sing along.

Then, on Saturday, April 30, you can hear **Bare Bones**, a trio consisting of **Becky** and **Bill Kimmons** and **Mark Davis**. Becky grew up listening to her southern West Virginia grandmother sing pop songs of the early 20th century and old ballads in the keening style of the Primitive Baptists. Bill discovered traditional Appalachian music when he moved to West Virginia in 1976. Mark Davis, an elementary school music teacher by day, is also lead vocalist and percussionist with the Afro-pop band VooDoo Katz. He has studied percussion in Africa twice.



As a trio, Bare Bones brings an intimate but powerful 'a cappella' approach to material ranging from old country gospel to R&B standards, from murky traditional songs to crafted songs by Lotus Dickey and others. Samples of their music can be found at <u>http://www.cdbaby.com/Artist/BareBones1</u>
