This year, our special guests include French Canadian-style fiddler, Lisa Ornstein who befriended old-time fiddle legend Tommy Jarrell in her teens, and mastered the "Round Peak style." She went on to tour for twelve years with the internationally acclaimed La Bottine Souriante and is widely known for her compelling and inventive playing and her impeccable tune choice. Rodney Miller is widely considered to be the foremost exponent of New England style fiddling and was designated a "Master Fiddler" by the National Endowment for the Arts for his sweetly melodic playing. **Kimberley** Fraser has been playing Cape Breton style fiddle and piano since early childhood, and though still in her twenties she is artistic director of the fabulous Celtic Colours festival in Cape Breton Nova Scotia and tours widely, teaching and performing the music of her home. U.S. National Scottish Fiddle Champion, Elke Baker, whose lyrical melodies combined with driving dance rhythms characterize her energetic fiddling has just completed a recording with hammered dulcimer virtuoso and fiddle player Ken Kolodner, and his son, Bradley on banjo. Joe DeZarn is a gifted performer of Irish music on the fiddle and has been heating up dance floors all over the mid-Atlantic region for decades. No fiddle retreat would be complete without old-time fiddler, Joe Herrmann, who toured as the fiddler for West Virginia's own Critton Hollow String Band.
