In 1988, storyteller J.G. Pinkerton launched storytelling festivals across the state of Connecticut on the Saturday before Thanksgiving. He called the events "Tellabration!" The number of events increased at a rate of 500% a year and now well over 40,000 people around the world, on every continent except Antarctica, enjoy stories during Tellabration! In 1996, BFMS sponsored its first Tellabration!, and we have seen its popularity increase every year. Folks look

forward to this annual event to hear a wide variety of stories from twelve of the region's finest storytellers. In this day of mass media, it is a terrific way to spend a relaxing and enjoy-

able Saturday evening with friends before the hectic holiday season is upon us. Stories include traditional stories, personal stories, stories that will make you laugh one minute and cry the next, and stories from many cultural traditions. The earlier part of the evening from 7 to 8:30 are family stories for the young and young at heart. The secret is out that some of the best stories and best storytellers are presented at this time. Adult storytelling begins at 8:30 and goes until 11. Attentive

children are welcome to stay for adult storytelling. It is the tradition of Baltimore's Tellabration! to bring canned goods and non-perishable food to benefit needy families through the Towson Assistance Center. Reliable sources report that audience members who contribute canned goods enjoy the stories twice as much. Delicious refreshments will be available

for sale. On Saturday, November 20, you can enjoy storytelling from Sacramento to Savannah, Boise to Barcelona, West Virginia to the West Indies, and from Tokyo to Towson.

We are pleased to have Alan Klein as the Master of Ceremonies for Tellabration! Alan has successfully organized and hosted a number of "Liars' Contests." His enthusiasm for a good story is contagious.

25 Stevenson Lane in Towson. Stevenson Lane is about 3 miles south of Baltimore Beltway exit 25, Charles Street. The church is located just off Charles Street on Stevenson Lane. 

#### **The Best Part**

We lost, quite suddenly, one of the gems of our community, David Beale. Dave, as I always knew him, had a warm and ready smile and an enthusiastic, kind word for everyone. He had a marvelous joyous signature spin! Dave danced English and Scottish and American; he was always a gentle man and always a gentleman. He loved his family, playing Wiffle Ball, bowling, watching sports. He dedicated his work-day life to volunteering in hospitals. Dave wanted to be a part of life, and he cared for others.

I was lucky enough to dance with Dave twice the week before he died. I always knew my spirit would lift if I took a turn around the floor with Dave. Dave loved the music, always, and was full of delight at every tune, every medley, every dance, every partner. I could count on Dave's smiles and hugs to wipe away some of the world's cynicism. As a caller, I loved to watch Dave dance, for his enjoyment and concentration on his partner were pure and of the moment.

But I know the moment I will cherish most: The Monday Dave and I were dancing an English dance at St. Mark's. It was a dance that contains a pousette, a figure where partners face, two folks who may be strangers anywhere else but in that moment. Then, looking at one another and holding two hands they guide each other—one drawing, one inviting the other—to a new spot on the floor. As we began to pousette, Dave looked me full in the face with his winning smile and utter focus and said, "This is the best part."

Oh, Dave, it sure is the best part. We'll miss you.
