How do you make it so affordable?

Catocotin is an all-volunteer weekend. Campers sign up for two short jobs when they arrive. Each job takes an hour or less. This is also a fun part of the weekend with good conversation and sometimes singing!

What do we do?

Campers lead activities. Past workshops included dance, instrumental, singing, crafts, yoga, juggling, and storytelling.

Historic log cabins built circa 1935 by the WPA with electric lighting (but no outlets). Modern bath houses with lots of water and indoor plumbing. Limited space in cabin with indoor plumbing at additional cost. Meals are family style in our large indoor dining/dance hall with vegetarian and omnivore options, prepared by campers under the guidance of an experienced chef. Snacks and hot and cold drinks are always available.
