Widely known as one of the foremost and most influential hammered dulcimer players in the U.S. and a fine old-time fiddler, Baltimore's **Ken Kolodner** (also hammered mbira) is joined by his son, **Brad Kolodner** who has rapidly gained national recognition for his delicate touch and writing on the claw-hammer and gourd banjo and banjola.

Their 2011 release **Otter Creek** was the most played instrumental recording on The Folk Charts. Join them for an evening of tight musical arrangements of original and old-time music "played in the purest way" on twin fiddles, banjo, guitar, hammered dulcimer, vocals and more!
